

# GENEROUS MONETARY DONATIONS FROM THE 2023 EVENT MADE SPECIAL CONTRIBUTION TO SHEBOYGAN COUNTY FOOD BANK POSSIBLE



The Making Spirits Bright Board of Directors presented a \$50,000 check to Sheboygan County Food Bank (SCFB) in support of the purchase of a food collection transport truck. During the Making Spirits Bright drive-through holiday lights show, SCFB is the partner organization and recipient of the food pantry donations collected. The SCFB trucks have moved over 1.1 million pounds of food over the event's 12-year run. The special \$50,000 donation, made possible by the generosity of the just over 73,000 visitors to the 2023 Making Spirits Bright event, will go towards the purchase of a truck that will replace the one currently used. The truck needs many expensive repairs and is no longer reliable.

The check presentation occurred during the Sheboygan Rotary's Good Citizen of the Year dinner. Liz Kroll, founder of SCFB, was this year's Good Citizen award recipient. Dave Hoffman, Making Spirit's Bright steering committee chair, presented the check. Hoffman is a fellow Rotarian and became the Making Spirits Bright event chair starting in 2024. Also on hand was Mike Vandersteen, President of the Board of Directors for Making Spirits Bright.

This check brings the total of Making Spirits Bright donations to SCFB to \$205,000.

#### WORKING TO MAKE SURE NO ONE GOES HUNGRY IN SHEBOYGAN COUNTY



Did you know that about 11% of Sheboygan County residents are struggling with hunger? Sheboygan County Food Bank is dedicated to making sure nutritious food reaches thousands of families, children and seniors in need by distributing food through its core programs and in partnership with food pantries and other organizations.

"Families and individuals continue to struggle with the deep impact of inflation. As the people we serve in all our programs, pantries and other agencies continues to increase, the increase in food prices also affects us as we spend a big portion of our annual budget on food purchases. This double impact makes it even a greater challenge to meet the need." – Patrick Boyle, Executive Director, Sheboygan County Food Bank

In 2024, Sheboygan County Food Bank is tracking an increasing average of close to 6,000 family visits each month at food pantries and other partner organizations. More guests are visiting their Community Cafe where an average of about 1,500 warm meals are being served each month. And since even more children are at risk to face hunger, their Food for Thought for Kids program to get weekend snacks and meals in the hands of the most vulnerable children in our community has grown to support 500 children during the 2024-2025 school year.





















#### BEHIND THE SCENES HEROES







Officially we are announcing 1,120,000; although, granted, a few may slip past us to get in the count.














#### CREATIVE VAL MAKES THE VOLUNTEER TRAILER FUN


Of all the displays he's been involved with, the Heatmeister is his favorite. He envisioned it, had assistance drawing it and then was key in constructing it to a long-standing display.
